Place-based – People-centered Services & Resources

The East Portland Community Office (EPCO) is one of seven geographically based community hubs designated by the City's [Office Community & Civic Life](#) to support community building, civic engagement, and advocacy.

We offer support to the 28% of Portland's residents that live work and come together in East Portland. Our service area covers Portland east of 82nd Avenue/I-205 (map on back).

EPCO is a community-driven Office dedicated to serving and working with East Portlanders in carrying out their community building and civic engagement activities and projects.

We provide support by

- **Connecting** - We connect community members to resources and organizations.
- **Project assistance** - Assistance with outreach, project planning, grant writing.
- **Skill-building** - Trainings, workshops, one-on-one support.
- **Information and Referral** - Who do you call about a pothole? Where can small businesses get assistance? We'll help you get answers.
- **Fostering collaboration** - We support cross-organizational collaboration on projects and advocacy on public policy.

Resources available with EPCO

- Funding for community-driven projects – three different funding programs,
- Event equipment - outdoor canopies, tables, chairs, cones, barricades,
- Meeting space, easels, easel pads, markers,
- Communication tools – Newsletter, social media,
- Clean up equipment,
- Public address systems (microphones and speakers),
- Headset equipment for interpretation,
- Laptop, projector and screen, community computer with graphics software,
- FAX, scanner, copy machine.

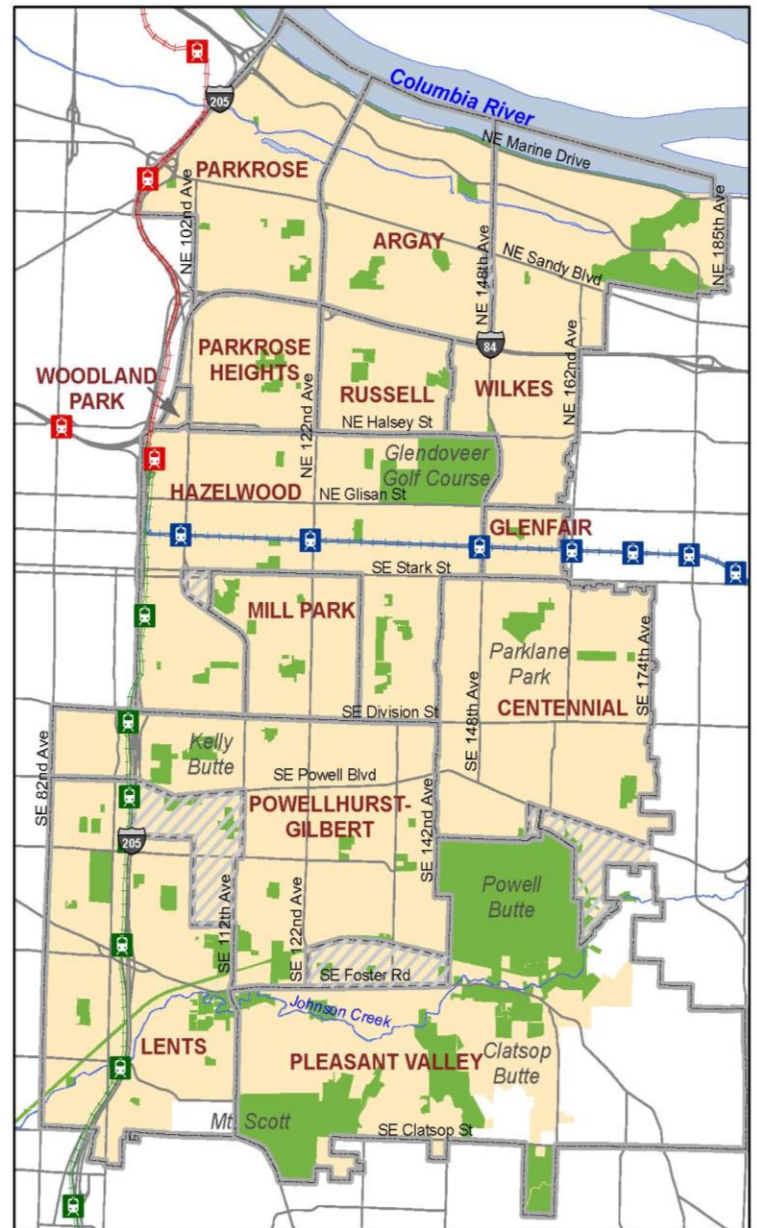
